**Tier 1: Awareness** – Provides a general awareness of Palliative & End of Life Care (PEoLC), including carers, members of the public, colleagues in H&SC.

**Tier 2: Essential Skills** - Aimed at Health and Social Care professionals who require knowledge and skills to provide PEoLC in their work environment.

**Tier 3: Specialist Skills** – Aimed at Health and Social care professionals requiring an in-depth knowledge of providing care and support for individuals approaching and needing Palliative or End of Life Care.
